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2024 Mazda MX-5 Miata gets a ton of significant updates It should drive better, look fresh and finally has Mazda's latest infotainment

The 2024 Mazda MX-5 Miata is officially here, and the updates previewed by the JDM model are thankfully being carried over into the U.S. spec car today. As we suspected, the update is thorough enough to perhaps call it the "ND3," making it the third significant version of this generation.

Mechanically, Mazda says it's installed a new steering rack with internal revisions for less fric-

tion and then updated the electric assist calibration through software. This results in "smoother steering action with a more defined 'on-center' feeling for relaxed freeway cruising, yet greater precision as the front tires are loaded up under hard cornering," per Mazda. We'll be excited to try it out.

Manual transmission Club and Grand Touring trims (read: not the base Sport trim) add a new asymmetric limited-slip differential that features a new cam mechanism for different ramp angles on acceleration and deceleration. Mazda says "a stronger lockup under engine braking improves stability at corner entry, resisting unwanted oversteer," and "reduced lockup during acceleration reduces unwanted understeer."

A new "DSC Track" mode's been added to the stability control system and is designed to give you more leeway for track driving without completely losing stability control aid, which, again, is only on the Club and Grand Touring models.

As we expected, the powertrain options remain the same, meaning your only engine choice is a 2.0-liter naturally aspirated four-cylinder – 181 horsepower and 151 pound-feet of torque – paired with either a six-speed manual or six-speed automatic w/paddle shifters.

The aesthetic changes for the 2024 Miata are subtle, but look closely and you'll notice new LED headlights, new LED taillights and new wheel designs. There's also a new color (pictured first in the gallery at the top of this post) called Aero Gray that comes with a \$450 upcharge.

2024 Mazda MX-5 Miata Detailed, Including Pricing and New Colors - by Joey Capparella/Road & Track The subtly revised roadster, starting at \$30,150, features a new look and changes to the steering and optional limited-slip differential.

- Mazda announced pricing and more details for the revised 2024 MX-5 Miata.
- Changes include tweaked headlights and taillights, a new steering rack, a new "asymmetric" limited-slip differential, and newly available exterior and interior colors.
- The MX-5 Miata will start at \$30,150 for the Sport roadster and \$38,115 for the RF retractable-hardtop model.

The endearingly persistent Mazda MX-5 Miata keeps chugging along, and 2024 brings

several notable changes to the diminutive droptop. We had previously seen the updates applied to the Japan-spec model, but we now have details on the U.S.-spec 2024 MX-5 Miata, including pricing information and key changes that include revisions both visually and under the skin.

New LED headlights and taillights freshen up the Miata's look somewhat, and there are also new wheel designs and a newly available color called Aero Gray that costs \$450 extra. A tan Nappa leather upholstery option is now a \$300 option on the Grand Touring trim level, and the interior also receives a more clearly marked gauge cluster and a larger 8.8-inch infotainment screen. Mazda also says it added padding on the center console.

Mechanically, there's a new steering rack and revised software calibration for the steering's electric assist. For models equipped with the limited-slip differential, there's a new unit that Mazda calls an "Asymmetric LSD" that promises improved stability and sharper cornering with less unwanted oversteer and understeer. There's a new setting for the stability control called "DSC-Track" that raises the intervention threshold for the system. We look forward to trying these new features out ourselves to see how they perform.



The powertrain is unchanged and remains a 181-hp 2.0-liter inline-four combined with rear-wheel drive and a six-speed manual transmission. There's still a six-speed automatic available on the Grand Touring trim, but we're not sure why anyone would want to pay extra for that.

Pricing is up slightly, with the base Sport softtop model rising \$935 to a new starting price of \$30,150. The Club softtop starts at \$33,650 and the Grand Touring is \$35,450. The RF retractable-hardtop version is more expensive, starting at \$38,115 and only available in the upper trims. A Brembo/BBS/Recaro package with upgraded brakes, wheels, and seats, is available for \$4800 on the Club softtop and comes standard on the Club RF. Mazda says the revised Miata will go on sale in the U.S. before spring has sprung.
